Clonmult Ambush Centenary Celebration

As many of you may know the 20th February 2021 is the centenary of Clonmult Ambush. The committee of Clonmult Ambush Commemoration are non-political and as a community they want to honour the sacrifices those Volunteers made in Clonmult 100 years ago on our be-half. On that fateful day 12 members of the East Cork Flying Column lost their lives in Clonmult and 3 more members would die before the Truce in July of 1921. They came from the parishes of Cobh, Aghada, Ballymacoda/Ladysbridge, Cloyne, Imogeela, Killeagh/Inch, Midleton and Kilbrittain. For the past few years a public commemoration has been held at the battle site but this year due to Covid-19 the Commemoration will be Virtual, via Facebook/YouTube. The Flying Column's area of operation began in Dunkettle and stretched from there to Knockraha, along the boundaries of East Cork, North Cork, Cork Waterford border to Youghal along the coastline ending in Cobh. This was their area of responsibility. For this year's Commemoration the celebration committee request all parishes to remember those who died in Clonmult in their prayers for the dead on Saturday 20th and Sunday 21st February.
